Byhalia, Mississippi--- Mr. Aaron Eugene Mardis 66, passed away February 26, 2011 at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Memphis, TN: He was born to Clyde and Quay Joshlin Mardis on November 6, 1944 in Union County Mississippi. He graduated from Treadwell High School in Memphis, TN in 1964. He was a Marine Corps Veteran of Vietnam where he survived the Seige of Con Thien, participated in 24 search and destroy operations, and fought in the Battle for Hue. In 1976 he caught a 16 lb. 4 oz. large mouth bass which remains the Arkansas State record. He painted elevated water tanks. He was a member of the Olive Branch Church of Christ.
