June 26, 1930 - September 20, 2012

Ripley, Mississippi--- Mr. James Milton "Bud" Huddleston - The BlueGrass Legend 82, passed away September 20, 2012 at the North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo, Mississippi. Bud was born on June 26, 1930 to Robert Burton and Mamie Faye Whitten Huddleston in Tippah County Mississippi. He was a mechanic for Farrow Ward Ford before retiring. He was a very well known bluegrass musician throughout the South. He was a long time faithful member of Whittentown Baptist Church, where he had served as a Deacon for many years.
