Dorothy E. Pressley Stark passed away August 8, 2025 at the age of 96 at Tippah County Hospital. She was born in New Orleans, Louisiana on October 21, 1928 to Ross Stark and Nora Boyette Stark. She worked for Tippah County Hospital for 15 years as an Anesthetist, Surgery Supervisor, Delivery Supervisor and ER Supervisor. She also worked for Union County Baptist Hospital as Director of Nursing for 7 years where she wrote the Nursing Procedures Handbook before it opened. She worked at Blue Mountain College as a Campus Registered Nurse for 22 years before retiring. She was a prior member of Mississippi Nursing Association, Red Cross Volunteer Nursing Association, Tennessee Nursing Association, National Nursing Association.

Dorothy was a member of First Baptist Church and began teaching Sunday School Class for 5 Year Old Boys Class, 40 Year Old Women's Class, and the 11th and 12th Grade Girls Class. She was a member of the First Baptist Church Choir until the age of 82. She taught Sunday School for 25 years at Rest Haven Nursing Home until her health no longer permitted.

Dorothy is survived by by one son: William Warren Pressley, Jr. of Oxford, MS; one step-son: Ronnie Stark (Rena) of Nesbit, MS; one niece: Dianne Stark of Georgia; one nephew: Rick Stark (Pam) of Georgia.
