



## Frances Elizabeth Reid (Street)

June 18, 1922 - April 7, 2013

Ripley, Mississippi--- Mrs. Frances Elizabeth Street Reid 90, passed away April 7, 2013 at the Tippah County Hospital in Ripley, Mississippi. She was the daughter of Oscar and Annie Pitner Street and was married to Marvin Fay Reid for 62 years who preceded her in death on July 22, 2004.

She was a graduate of Blue Mountain College and taught school for over 30 years in the Ripley School system where she was affectionately known as "Miss Frances". Her most treasured accomplishment in education was being appointed by Governor John Bell Williams to the Board of Public Educational Television.

She was a lifetime member of the First United Methodist Church, DAR, Huguenot Society, chartered member of the Jr. Civic League of Ripley.

Her family is credited with much of the progress and growth in Tippah County; such as the first telephone company and laid the foundation for the first electric power company. Her most cherished accomplishment was raising the funds to build the beautiful wrought iron fence that adorns the Ripley City Cemetery. She has provided a wealth of information to all who was interested in the history of Tippah County.
