“ Remembering Danny Hefley

The Falkner High School senior class of 1961 was very special and unique. Our class was made up of about eighteen young ladies and about eleven boys. As evidence of our closeness, we have had a class reunion every five years since 1961. While many of us drifted apart after graduation, our minds have always gone back to the good days at Falkner school. This has been especially true since we learned of Danny's death last Sunday. This is what I remember about Danny Hefley during our school days at Falkner.

Danny Hefley was the vice president of our senior class. To many of us, he was our role model. He was a good-looking young man and had a great personality. He was Mr. Falkner High and Pat, his future wife, was Miss Falkner High. We thought of Danny and Pat as our perfect couple.

Danny was an Eagle Scout, loved rabbit hunting, and was a great baseball and basketball player. I was on the baseball team with Danny in 1960 when we became the Tippah County Champions. Danny played center field that season and batted 431.

Danny was the editor of the Annual Staff and I was vice-president. I told him I learned what a "vice-president" did -- "The VP did all the work and the president got the credit."

Danny and Pat were special to the class of 1961 because their mothers, probably since the first grade, served as homeroom moms and took care of us as if we were their own. We all loved our homeroom moms dearly.

Even though it has been nearly fifty years, I can always remember that Danny's birthday was in April. Danny would tell us, "Mother said we can't pull our shoes off and go bare foot until after my birthday." And so we did. We waited until after Danny's birthday and soon we could walk on gravel roads or anything else and feel no pain.
