She was the daughter of the late Mary Mintor Maddox McCoy (McCoy) and Richard Randolph McCoy (McCoy) of Tiplersville, MS. She was a sister to the late Mary Virginia McCoy Coltharp of Walnut, MS. She is survived by her only child, Mary Kathleen McMillin Blount (William) of Knoxville, TN, two grandchildren, Michael Blount (Ashley) in Nashville, TN and Samuel Blount of Birmingham, AL. She has three great-grandchildren, Baker Louis, Matthew William, and Thomas Arthur all of Nashville, TN. She is also survived by two close grandnieces, Jamie C. They lived in various places including Louisiana, Florida, Memphis TN, and Amherst OH, during their marriage.
