November 5, 1936 - May 29, 2020

Memphis, TN - Shirley Marie Stewart Saine, 84, passed away May 29, 2020, at Methodist North ICU in Memphis, TN. She was born to George Hezekiah Stewart, and Minnie Jean Braddock Stewart. Shirley grew up in Ripley, MS; she was an active member in Ripley Presbyterian Church; graduating from Ripley High School in 1954; and attended Northeast Mississippi Community College. After attending Northeast Community College, Shirley moved to Memphis, TN. She was a retired employee of the Med. in Memphis TN. Shirley was a Christian and a very active member of Bellevue Baptist Church in Memphis, TN.

She is survived by two brothers: Joe W. Stewart of Starkville, MS and Billy George Stewart of Memphis, TN, as well as a host of friends and loved ones. While Shirley had no biological sisters, she counted it a blessing that she had many sisters in the Christian faith who accepted her as if she were their family member. They went on trips together, shared "family" gatherings, shared each other's heartaches and physical pains, and were sisters in the truest definition of "sister". Shirley loved them as sisters.

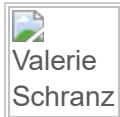
